CPPA Memo 21-08 September 30, 2008

Re: Charging Gun Related Crimes

“It is the position of this Association that city gun ordinances deemed illegal by state CCW legislation which was upheld by the Ohio Supreme Court, should no longer be voluntarily enforced by our Members. We believe, and have been legally advised, that any enforcement of these illegal city ordinances is in direct conflict with State law and WILL subject our members to civil liability.”
